Curriculum and Timetable	 Each class' weekly timetable is personalised to meet the needs of the individuals. The curriculum, including PE, is evolving and is created to reflect the motivations for individual children's needs and post – COVID Health Based whole-school strands. All pupils receive two hours of timetabled curriculum PE. All pupils have the opportunity to access a range of different sports and competitions. The specialist curriculum includes ASD specialists, Forest Schools, Conductive Education, Rebound Therapy, Sensory Curriculum, Hydrotherapy, Soft-Play, Outdoor and Adventurous Activities (On and Off site). 									
Other features	There are links with primary, secondary, academies and special schools.
