The School has 66 Sport Premium pupils which is approx. 62% of the total cohort • Current NoR EYFS 12, KS1 16, KS2 41, KS3 24, KS14-19 30. • All pupils have Education Health and Care Plans. • The classes within the school reflect our three specialist provisions; SLD, ASD and Conductive Education (CE). • All pupils have SEND and are taught in a Special School.
Staffing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The School has 10 FTE teachers, 3 part time teachers 1 Associate Teacher/Conductor, 1 Conductor, 6 HLTAs and 45 teaching support staff.
Curriculum and Timetable	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each class' weekly timetable is personalised to meet the needs of the individuals. The curriculum, including PE, is strong and is in place to reflect the motivations for individual children's needs across whole-school strands of physical development. • All pupils receive two hours of curriculum PE. • All pupils also have the opportunity to access a range of different sports, physical activities and competitions. • The specialist curriculum includes ASD specialists, Forest Schools, Conductive Education, Rebound Therapy, Sensory Curriculum, Hydrotherapy, Soft-Play, Outdoor and Adventurous Activities (On and Off site).
Other features	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • There are links with other local primary, secondary, academies and special schools.

1.	Increase confidence, knowledge, fitness, skills and leadership of all pupils through PE, Physical Activity & School Sport.
2.	The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, including creative activities.
